Rare hollies dating back to the 1830s have been found in the grounds. Six species are identified in a report by the Welsh Historic Gardens Society, together with Butcher's Broom (Ruscus Aculeatus), which was formerly used by butchers to clean their cutting blocks, and Japanese Spindle (Euonymus Japonicus). Together these discoveries indicate mid Victorian planting. The report also identifies the remains of a fernery near the main entrance.
